

LISTA ZAWODÓW SPEŁNIAJĄCYCH WARUNEK LOTERII WIZOWEJ DV-2013

DOTYCZĄCY DOŚWIADCZENIA ZAWODOWEGO

Warunek ten mówi, że zwycięzca loterii, **o ile nie posiada średniego wykształcenia**, będzie musiał wykazać, że w przeciągu ostatnich 5 lat przez 2 lata pracował w zawodzie, do wykonywania którego niezbędne są co najmniej 2 lat szkolenia bądź doświadczenia zawodowego. Lista zawodów spełniających to kryterium wg standardów amerykańskich jest przedstawiona poniżej (są to zawody ze strefy 4 i 5). Niestety została ona bardzo zawężona w stosunku do lat poprzednich, w których Polacy brali udział w losowaniu.

Każdy zawód na tej liście podlinkowany jest do szczegółowego opisu zawierającego m.in. zakres obowiązków. Jeśli nie znajdziesz swojego zawodu na liście, to wyszukaj zawody bardzo podobne i sprawdź szczegółową listę obowiązków. Jeśli te obowiązki pokrywają się z tymi wykonywanymi przez Ciebie, to masz duże szanse na otrzymanie zielonej karty.

Jeśli jednak na liście nie ma zawodów zbliżonych do Twojego, to jeśli liczysz na zwycięstwo w loterii, jak najszybciej zapisz się do 2-letniego Liceum Uzupełniającego dla Dorosłych. Świadectwo ukończenia szkoły średniej otrzymasz wiosną 2013r. W sprzyjających okolicznościach będziesz mieć szansę na otrzymanie zielonej karty. Spotkania ze zwycięzcami są bowiem zaplanowane do 30-go września 2013r.

Podkreślam, lista ta ma znaczenie tylko dla osób, które nie posiadają średniego wykształcenia. Jeśli masz co najmniej średnie wykształcenie lub wkrótce (wiosna 2012r.) będziesz je mieć, nie czytaj dalej.
